WESTERN AUSTRALIA - STATE WAGE 2019 INCREASE

These **PINK** sheets are only for the benefit of:

• Sole traders/partnerships in Western Australia.

The federal/state system and your position

Sole traders and partnerships in W.A. remain under the W.A. state system. The W.A. Government, unlike other State governments, decided not to handover to the Federal Labor Government in Canberra the power to regulate conditions for sole traders/partnerships in 2009. This means that the federal system – *the Fair Work Act 2009* - does not apply to you.

What are the relevant awards for AMIC sole traders/partnerships in W.A.?

They remain:

- Meat Industry (State) Award 2003; and
- Clerks' (Wholesale & Retail Establishments) Award No. 38 of 1947.

Wage decision of the W.A. Industrial Relations

On 14th June 2019, the W.A. Industrial Relations Commission handed down the state wage decision. The commission decided to increase award rates by 2.75%. The effect is that it raises the minimum wage in W.A. for sole trader/partnerships to \$746.90 – this is Level 1 in the Meat Industry (State) Award 2003. The operative date for the increase is the **First Full Pay Period to commence on or After 1 July 2019.**

As is usual and in line with previous decisions:

- Junior and Apprentice wages receive a proportionate increase depending upon age and year respectively;
- The 2.75% increase can be absorbed into any over-award payment.

Latest wage sheets

These sheets contain the new rates for retail, processing and smallgoods sectors if you operate as a sole trader/partnership. They also include the junior and apprentice percentages of the relevant award grade. They also include the clerical and administrative rates and percentages.

All other terms and conditions

These are to be found in the W.A. State Meat award.
